### Zion Budget Update

Thank you for your generous budget support! Zion's 2023-24 budget is \$416,400. Divided by 12 months, the offerings needed average \$34,700 per month. Zion ended 2023 on a strong note. However, since January of 2024, the monthly totals have decreased by \$11,000 on average. With 5 months remaining in the budget year, Zion needs to average \$29,000 per month to meet the budget.
