Fellowship hall/coffee bar and nursery screen project: As you may have read in the minutes, for the past few months Church Council has been discussing the installation of one screen for the fellowship hall area (on the wall behind the coffee bar), and a smaller screen for the nursery. Council has approved this project with input and support from the Trustees, the Sound and Video team, the Formation ministry team, the Interior Memorial and Visual Arts team, and the Elders. The screens will not be connected for TV viewing. The intention is to use these two screens on Sunday mornings to provide a way to view the worship service from other locations. They are a tool to help make worship accessible for everyone by including those serving in the nursery, or in the fellowship hall/coffee bar area. Another anticipated use is to provide an optional location for families to show their photos during visitation and memorial services, and other gatherings or events. Spiritual Leadership Team Minutes

May 13, 2O24

Opening Devotion: Suz led the opening focusing on Revelation 22:17. "The Spirit and the bride say, "Come!" And let the one who hears say, "Come!" Let the one who is thirsty come; and let the one who wishes take the free gift of the water of life." This verse has become meaningful to her in relation to the song "Come Jesus Come" by Stephen McWhirter. We listened to the song, and Suz closed in prayer

Discussion of theme for SLT devotion time: We discussed several options including using a book to give structure to the devotional time or bringing individual concerns for support. After considering all the suggestions, we decided to use the book, *Divine Gravity: Sparking a Movement to Recover a Better Christian Story*, by Meghan Larissa Good. Several of us had read parts of it, and the book focuses on some of the themes we had discussed during our winter retreat.

Reaction to Sue's sabbatical: SLT members reported that they hadn't heard many comments. The comments they did receive had been positive. Sue had received a few concerns about events that might happen while she is gone where her presence would be missed. Overall, Sue reported that feedback had been very positive to her, also.

Memorial funds: Greg reported that he had been asked about a memorial gift given for use with the MYF, but as an MYF sponsor, he hadn't heard anything about it. He wondered how gifts given as memorials are processed and communicated. He will continue this conversation with the Stewardship team to learn more.

Search for new elder(s): The updated elder ministry description is ready and will be given to the Gifts Discernment team. It will also be shared with Bethany to be kept in the office. Names of potential elders were suggested, and will be passed along to the Gifts Discernment team.

Congregation Caregivers: At the last meeting, it was brought up that there is a need for a few more caregivers, since some caregivers are no longer able to serve. The co-chairs of the Congregational Caregivers asked if the SLT could help suggest names of people they could approach to serve. Names were suggested and will be passed along. It is possible that some of these new caregivers might be asked primarily to serve short term for current caregivers who aren't around during the winter months.

Good Shepherd Church renovation: Church Council and Stewardship have been looking at ways to help the Good Shepherd congregation with their sanctuary rebuilding project. Their recommendation was to give a check now, and then see where things stand at the end of the fiscal year, and possibly give more. This will be considered a contribution, and not a loan. John David will prepare an announcement to share this information with the congregation, and invite them to consider financially supporting this need.

Reporting on the life of the congregation: John David is continuing toward his goal to meet with individuals and families in the congregation. Things he has been focusing on or thinking about include:

- Hearing God's voice; discerning God's will; appreciative inquiry:
- Being curious about what's happening in the life of the congregation;
- Looking at where Zion is ready to grow;
- Wondering what people value, and what is a strength that could continue to be built on;
- Ways of encouraging people to talk about their faith. (He is finding that people are more inclined to talk about how they see *others* showing the love of Jesus, than talking about their own faith. He wonders about ways for teaching/modeling how to have these types of God conversations)

A theme that is rising from these conversations with the congregation is that people see strong community at Zion and feel safe and supported.

Pastoral concerns were discussed. A few additional items were tabled until our next meeting due to lack of time for discussion
