With the help of other churches, we held them daily for three weeks in August. Unfortunately, they were not very well attended. This year, we'd like to try scaling it down and making sure that people know that the picnics are for <u>all</u> children. We simply want to offer a lunch break to parents, grandparents, and babysitters as the summer winds down. We've teamed up with Archbold United Methodist Church and the Black Swamp Arts Council to offer *free children's picnic lunches in the covered picnic shelter near the Archbold pool and splash pad on Thursday, August 1st, Thursday, August 8th, and Thursday, August 15th from 12:00-1:00pm.* The Black Swamp Arts Council will have a craft table for children on August 1st and August 15th. Don't Forget

Zion Mennonite Women are once again doing the MCC School Kit Challenge: Notebooks and pencils are treasures for families around the world who have been forced to flee their homes or struggle to afford basic school supplies. Without these items, many kids in places like Ethiopia, Ukraine and South Sudan can't get the education they desperately need. The **School Kit Challenge**: 24,000 school kits to help 24,000 kids during the month of August. A list of needed items are: 4 spiral or perforated-page notebooks; about 21.5 cm x 27.5 cm (8.5 in x 11 in); approx. 140 pages (70 sheets) each, totaling 500–600 pages (250-300 sheets); 8 new unsharpened pencils; 1 ruler (flat, good quality; must indicate 30 cm (inch markings optional); 12 colored pencils (in packaging); 1 large eraser; 4 new black or blue ballpoint pens. MW will be collecting donations through August 14. Tax free days are July 30th through August 8th this year.
