Seeking a few helpers:

Picnics in Ruihley Park: Last year, Phil Nofziger had the idea to organize lunches in Ruihley Park to help bridge the gap between the free meals that NOCAC offers in the park (which end in late July) and the beginning of the school year. With the help of other churches, we held them daily for three weeks in August. Unfortunately, they were not very well attended. This year, we'd like to try scaling it down and making sure that people know that the picnics are for <u>all</u> children. We simply want to offer a lunch break to parents, grandparents, and babysitters as the summer winds down. We've teamed up with Archbold United Methodist Church and the Black Swamp Arts Council to offer *free children's picnic lunches in the covered picnic shelter near the Archbold pool and splash pad on Thursday, August 1st, Thursday, August 8th, and Thursday, August 15th from 12:00-1:00pm.* The Black Swamp Arts Council will have a craft table for children on August 1st and August 15th. GloraBelle Yoder will be organizing the lunches on August 1st and August 8th (the Methodist Church is taking care of August 15th). See GloraBelle if you'd like to help with this opportunity.

East Garden Cookouts: The Archbold Area Ministerial Association has been offering free cookouts for the residents of the East Garden complex twice a month this summer. *Zion's Mission in Service team is in charge of the cookout on Thursday evening, August 8th, from 5:00-6:30pm.* In the past, these cookouts have sometimes been poorly attended due to lack of consistent cookout dates and advertising. This year, with the help of an East Garden resident, attendance has been very good - averaging between 40-60 served. St John's Christian Church has graciously set up a trailer with most of the equipment churches will need. Zion Mennonite Women are once again doing the MCC School Kit Challenge: Notebooks and pencils are treasures for families around the world who have been forced to flee their homes or struggle to afford basic school supplies. Without these items, many kids in places like Ethiopia, Ukraine and South Sudan can't get the education they desperately need. The School Kit Challenge: 24,000 school kits to help 24,000 kids during the month of August. A list of needed items are: 4 spiral or perforated-page notebooks; about 21.5 cm x 27.5 cm (8.5 in x 11 in); approx. 140 pages (70 sheets) each, totaling 500–600 pages (250-300 sheets); 8 new unsharpened pencils; 1 ruler (flat, good quality; must indicate 30 cm (inch markings optional); 12 colored pencils (in packaging); 1 large eraser; 4 new black or blue ballpoint pens. MW will be collecting donations through August 14. Tax free days are July 30th through August 8th this year.

Children's book - *Children of the World* by Tessa Strickland, Kate DePalma and David Dean. This book invites young readers to explore the world and discover their place within it. Spiritual Leadership Team minutes

July 15, 2024

Opening: Barb led the opening using Chapter 1 of *Divine Gravity* by Meghan Good. In each chapter of the book, Good focuses on what she terms a "rediscovery." Rediscovery #1 is "Jesus is the authoritative lens through which God is seen and the Bible is interpreted." Our discussion focused on what it might mean to read the Bible through the lens of Jesus, and what we can learn about God through Jesus that we wouldn't have known otherwise. Barb ended the discussion with prayer. Greg will be in charge of the opening at the next meeting with chapter 2 of *Divine Gravity*.

Discussion related to Sue's sabbatical: Mike will make a verbal announcement on Sunday July 21 to remind the congregation about Sue's sabbatical, as well as his agreement to stay on as elder chair for one month past the end of his term to be available during Sue's sabbatical. The sabbatical document will be sent out electronically again, and a note about Mike's term extension will also appear in the newsletter. We discussed details about Sue's return after sabbatical, and the idea that there could be different expectations about her workload now that she has completed seminary. The annual congregational meeting in the fall was suggested as a good time to remind people of the perimeters of her job.

Continued discussion of memorial funds disbursement: Stewardship and Church Council have both been included in the discussion about creating a more consistent procedure for using memorial donations. Mike will create a statement giving our recommendations to Council to aid in making decisions.

Reporting on the life of the congregation:

- John David will be on vacation at Friedenswald on July 22-26.
- John David reported that many of the opportunities on the Gifts Discernment slate have been filled.
- For communion on Sunday August 11, Sue will be on her sabbatical, and also Suz will be gone, so we will need additional servers. We have enough juice and crackers. Barb will get bread.
- This fall, John David is working on a series about the book of Revelation. He is considering creating a guide that could be used by people for more in-depth study. In the spring, the focus will likely be on Anabaptist history and theology, in conjunction with the 500th anniversary of the Anabaptist movement in January, 2025.
- A baptism class will most likely be offered this school year.

Pastoral concerns were discussed.

The next meeting will be on Monday, August 19, at 5:00.
