SLT Minutes ~ August 19th

Opening:

Greg led the opening focusing on chapter 2 of the book *Divine Gravity* by Meghan Good. The rediscovery focus that she shares here is "Salvation encompasses the setting right of all things, on earth as it is in heaven."

Greg's impression of the chapter was that it contained a lot of "what ifs" The author discusses the expression "Jesus saves" and asks what exactly is he saving people from? Are we being saved from a "wrathful God"? Jesus was sent to show us what God is like, and Jesus did not bring wrath to those he interacted with. If instead we are being saved from problems in the world, it's a never-ending task. We work towards a perfect world, but achieving perfection is not realistic.

One of the chapter's suggested questions was "What would change about the story and message of Jesus without the resurrection?" The group kept returning to the idea that the resurrection brings hope to the message. It can be helpful to consider the possibility that even if we don't achieve perfection, when we at least try we can make the world better. The things that do become better can be glimpses of heaven. Greg closed the discussion with prayer.

SLT organization for 2024-25:

Chris Richer attended this meeting to get acquainted with the job of elder as he will be joining the group in September. A new elder chair is needed for the upcoming year as Mike ends his term as elder. The group encouraged both Greg and Suz to consider it, but neither felt completely comfortable with taking on the job. The elder chair is responsible for working with pastors to plan the agenda for each month's meeting, leading the meetings, attending council meetings, taking the lead on working with conference pastors if conflicts arise within the congregation, and having conversations with the Pastor-Congregation Relations Committee as needed.

After discussion, Greg and Suz agreed to be co-chairs dividing up the tasks in ways that felt most comfortable to them. Suz will get the agenda around and send out communications to the SLT and Greg will lead the meetings. Together they will share going to church council meetings and meeting with people as needed.

Memorial Funds

Procedures for memorial funds have been discussed with church council. It will be helpful to have a procedure outlined for working with memorial funds so that the plans that have been developed don't get forgotten as new people become involved. Mike will put together guidelines for disbursement for memorial funds.

Small groups

Those in charge of organizing small groups are asking SLT for guidance about what the vision might be for small groups. Some of the ideas that were brainstormed at the meeting were:

- the possibility of organizing groups based on interests (ex. Bible-study; social activities; spiritual disciplines)
- How could information be gathered about the types of experiences people are interested in with small groups?
- Would it be helpful to have a session during the Sunday school hour where people would be asked to identify ways that they might be community to each other?
- How might it work to assign people to small groups and designate several Sundays a year for those groups to meet during the Sunday school hour?

Ohio Mennonite Conference

Delegates for Ohio conference need to be selected. John David and Sue will be going. Mike volunteered to go as well. The SLT nominated some potential delegates, and Suz volunteered to contact them.

Discussions related to various activities within the church

- John David is making plans for Bible studies and spiritual practices this fall.
- The Worship Team will be asked to offer the Prayer for the Church and World on September 1 since John David filled in for their date on August 11. Barb will contact Bethany to set up the prayer schedule calendar for the upcoming year.
- Congregational caregivers have continued the process of seeking new people for the job. Julia Nafziger is joining the group; Linda Nafziger is leaving.
- Randy Stuckey will be getting an ad hoc committee together to review the church constitution and to propose changes that might be necessary. It's possible that a representative from the elders will be asked to be a part of that committee. Mike expressed interest.
- It is probably time to review the safe church policies again.
