Revelation Worship Series

November 3: Read Revelation 12-14 (sermon: Revelation 13:1-4)

- Compare with other birth stories and wilderness stories in the Bible. (Genesis 21, 1 Kings 17, Luke 2, Exodus 16)

Special guests this Sunday, November 3rd: We have the unique opportunity to learn more about the arsenic poisoning crisis in Bangladesh, called one of the worst in the world. Bill and Carole Schumacher, from Sharon Mennonite Church (Plain City, OH), assist an organization called the *Society of International Mission (SIM) Bangladesh* in their efforts to educate, treat symptoms, and prevent arsenic poisoning from wells. Bill and Carole were one of the mission speakers at Ohio Conference Annual Assembly 2023, and often visit churches to talk about their experiences. The Schumachers are excited to share with us about their recent trip to Bangladesh to see the progress of the program. They'll offer a short introduction to their work as a "mission moment" during worship, and also invite anyone who is interested in learning more to join them during the Sunday School hour.

Election Day Prayer

As election day draws near, the potential for anxiety can rise. One of our motivations, as your pastors, for tackling the Revelation worship series this fall was to offer a solid theological foundation for this season in our country. Since ancient times, human rulers and human kingdoms have come and gone. As citizens of the eternal Kingdom that Jesus embodied, our only allegiance belongs to the One on the Throne and to the Lamb. No political party, candidate, or ballot issue is worthy of our unquestioned loyalty or deserves our worship. So then, how can we respond in healthy ways to the tension we feel, or that we see around us? As the old hymn suggests, our most important response is to "Take it to the Lord in prayer." The sanctuary will be open on election day, Tuesday, November 5th, from 9:00am-7:00pm. If you'd like a quiet place to reflect and pray, you are welcome to come and go as you wish. The entrance near the office will be open all day. Whether you choose to come to the sanctuary, or prefer to remain at home, we invite you to consider the following as you pray:

- Pray for peace in your reaction to the outcome.
- Pray for peace and safety for all people.
- Pray for eyes to see the image of God in those who think or vote differently. (and those who choose not to vote).
- Pray against violence in the hours, days, and weeks to come.
- Pray for discernment and strength to live like Jesus, as you center your life around him.
- Praise God for hope! Jesus has already overcome, and walks with us and empowers us in the midst of our struggles.

Pastoral Review

The Pastor Congregation Relations Committee (PCRC) is patterning the upcoming pastoral review after the review document that was used in 2020, along with some updates. The PCRC has conferred with the Interim Conference Minister, Dan Miller, to look over the survey before releasing it to the congregation to be completed. The PCRC will also ask the pastors to fill out a form about themselves, which will be compared to the congregation's feedback. Both John David and Sue were asked if there was anything they would like to see added to the survey before the final draft is completed.

The review process timeline will be as follows:

- · November 10th: Surveys are available for completion and will close on December 10th.
- · **December/ January:** PCRC will compile and evaluate the responses to the survey.
- · January/ February: PCRC will review a summary of the evaluation and responses with Pastors and Elders
- · February/March: PCRC will provide the Congregation with a summary of results.

Electronic survey responses are encouraged via Google Docs and a link will be provided. Paper surveys will be available on the table across the mailboxes, and PCRC members would also be willing to have face-to-face sit-downs to receive direct input from congregants and a sign-up sheet will be available for those on the table.
