Spiritual Leadership Team minutes November 11, 2024

Devotion: Suz led the devotions, based on the first half of Chapter 5 of *Divine Gravity*. The author describes two different approaches to spiritual life as it connects to the outside world using the stories of Noah and Joshua. Noah's approach was to lock himself and his people (and animals!) in and brave the storm. Joshua's approach was to march into foreign lands and convert people at sword point. In modern times, some people have become so opposed to the pushy Joshua method that they have taken a more Noah-like approach of following God in their own way, staying away from interfering with the lives of others. The author suggests a third alternative instead. (We decided to save this for a devotion at a future meeting) It was time to renew our Elder Covenant with Zion for the year. Greg read through the covenant and there was some discussion for clarification before we signed it.

Discussion items

- We would like to do an SLT retreat again and will work out details at the next meeting.
- The next meeting for Ohio Conference delegates is in mid-January 2025.

• There was discussion about how scheduling of outside speakers for Sunday worship services is handled, specifically to clarify what the roles are for the Collaborative Ministry Team, elders, and the Worship Team in this. After much discussion, we concluded that while the SLT has no desire to micromanage teams within Zion, in situations involving interaction with outside groups such as other congregations or educational institutions, there should be involvement and discernment from the pastors and SLT on the final decision.

Pastoral concerns within the congregation were discussed.

Next meeting is December 9 at 5:30pm. Chris will lead the opening, continuing on with Chapter 5 of Divine Gravity.
