Anabaptist History and Theology Class

On January 21, 1525, outside Zurich, Switzerland, a group of young adults were baptized upon their confession of faith in Jesus, breaking with the state church. This started a reform movement within Christianity that has endured—often through persecution and hardship—for 500 years.

As part of Zion Mennonite Church's commemoration of 500 years of Anabaptism, John David will teach a series of weekly classes on Anabaptist history and theology **beginning on January 21**, 2025. Spiritual Leadership Team minutes December 9, 2024

Opening: Sue led the opening with a table liturgy from the book, *The New Anabaptist: Practices for Emerging Communities,* by Stuart Murray. After prayer, we ate a simple soup meal.

Topics of Discussion:

• There was discussion about what we've heard from the congregation. One topic has been how there are fewer people at events. While there seems to be some concern that this might be a Zion problem, we noted that there are fewer people involved in *many* other activities in the area, including non-church related events. We also noted that we've had several members from Zion moving into Fairlawn, including some who will probably be staying in nursing care.

• Ohio Conference Delegate Cluster meeting will be on January 16, 2025. One of the changes coming up in the Ohio Conference is moving from two regional pastors to one. Dan Miller's term as Interim Conference Minister will be ending after the Annual Conference Assembly in March, and a new Conference Minister is still being sought.

- There was considerable discussion about an SLT retreat. We've had one the last two years, but previously it hadn't been a yearly event. Is it necessary to have one every year? Sue remarked it has been a time for bonding among members of the SLT, and there is value in that. It was decided we would have a day retreat, rather than stay overnight this year, which will include our regular meeting for the month.
- Pastoral Concerns were discussed.

Next meeting will be on January 18, 2025 as part of the SLT retreat. Chris Richer will lead the opening.
