January 26th - Anabaptist World Fellowship Sunday: This January marks the 500th anniversary of the birth of the Anabaptist movement. We're planning a celebration to commemorate this occasion on Sunday, January 26th. Elizabeth Miller, Director of the Institute for the Study of Global Anabaptism and professor of history at Goshen College, will be preaching during worship and the Zion Choir will be singing. Elizabeth will also share recent stories of hope and faith from global Anabaptist communities in an event open to the community in the afternoon at 3:00pm. Don't miss this Sunday!

Feb 4, 9, 16, 23, Mar 2 - Anabaptist Texts: In the Sundays leading up to Lent, we'll look at texts and themes important to the early Anabaptists, exploring topics such as 'Jesus as the Foundation'; 'Communion and Ordinances'; 'Gelassenheit (yieldedness)'; 'Love for Enemies'; and 'Community and Discipleship.'

Anabaptist History and Theology Class

On January 21, 1525, outside Zurich, Switzerland, a group of young adults were baptized upon their confession of faith in Jesus, breaking with the state church. This started a reform movement within Christianity that has endured—often through persecution and hardship—for 500 years.

As part of Zion Mennonite Church's commemoration of 500 years of Anabaptism, John David will teach a series of weekly classes on Anabaptist history and theology **beginning on January 21**, 2025. Classes will last an hour and will be offered on **most Tuesdays at 7PM** at Zion Mennonite Church in Room 310.
