This Lent, let us gather together to break bread, savor the divine generosity of God, and rise to share with the world out of the abundance we have received from the Bread of Life. The table is open. Come, be renewed.

- Lent 4 Sunday, March 30th: "Bread for Sharing" Luke 14:7-14 (Parable of the Great Banquet)
- Lent 5 Sunday, April 6th: "Bread for Community" Luke 19:1-10 (Dinner with Zacchaeus)
- Lent 6 Palm Sunday, April 13th: "Bread for the Road" John 12:12-16; Luke 19:28-40 (Triumphal Entry)

<u>Holy Week Drop-In Prayer and Spiritual Practices</u>: The sanctuary will be open at specified times in the morning and evening during Holy Week for anyone to come to sit in God's presence, pray, read scripture, draw, write, etc...This will be unstructured time to come and go as you wish.

Thursday, April 17 - Maundy Thursday Soup Supper, 6:00pm. Come remember Jesus' final Passover meal with his disciples, in which Jesus washed their feet, and instituted the bread and cup as symbols of his body and blood given for each of us. We'll gather together around the fellowship hall tables to eat a light soup supper, study scripture, wash one another's feet or hands, and serve one another communion.

<u>Friday, April 18th - Good Friday Service, 7:00pm</u>. Join us in the sanctuary for a short observance of scripture readings and the extinguishing of candles. We'll depart this service in silence to remember the sense of heaviness and hopelessness that descended upon the disciples on the day of Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion.

<u>Sunday, April 20th - Easter Sunday Celebration:</u> Come early for a breakfast potluck beginning at 8:30am, and hymn sing beginning at 9:00am. Worship at 9:30am.

Spiritual Leadership Team minutes - February 10, 2025

<u>Congregation Updates and Discussion:</u> The Sojourners class hosted a lunch at Fairlawn for the Builder's class, and for those at Fairlawn connected to Zion. About 50 people attended, including John David and Sue. It was a good opportunity to reconnect with people who haven't been able to make it to church regularly.

People have been asking about ways we might be able to help LAMP. The pastors have talked to the directors, Tahir Masood Bhatti and Fouzia Tahir, about finding a time to give an update during worship on how their work has been affected by recent changes. Some of their grant sources have been drying up, which they believe may be out of fear of connections to immigration.

Another immigration-related discussion was regarding the two Ukrainian families who came to the area with the help of the Refugee Resettlement Team - a group made up of persons from Zion and Central. The federal program the families came over with has ended, and it is unknown how that will affect them.

There was some discussion around the organization of teams and activities at Zion. Perhaps there should be consideration about downsizing or requiring less of a time commitment.

Pastoral care updates and concerns were shared.

<u>Community Connections</u>: The SLT would like to consider how to shape Zion's energy towards involvement in the community. The past two summers, we've hosted lunches for kids at Ruihley park in August, after the lunches offered by the Northwest Ohio Community Action Commission ended. We can see what may be offered this summer by NOCAC. Since these meals receive funding through grants, it's possible there may be changes.

Housing needs in the area were also mentioned. There are people in the community looking for opportunities to create more housing options, yet there is difficulty in finding places for the development of more affordable housing. We would be interested in learning if there are any projects we could get involved with related to this situation.

The SLT portion of the meeting concluded at 6:00, and the pastors were dismissed. The Elders met with Micah Frankenfield from PCRC to look over what they have learned from the congregation's pastoral performance evaluations, and discuss how to present the information to the pastors and the congregation.

The next meeting will be Monday, March 10 at 5:30 p.m. It will be Barb's turn for devotions.
